 - T5 Tank Sound Project (to be presented in early 2019) - working with Sydney Harbour Federation Trust, \$28k has been provided for the development of this project by the Australia Council. Artists: Chris Caines, Joyce Hinterding, David Haines and Gail Priest.
 - Jumaadi: My Love is in an Island far away (2019-2020) portrait series depicting Indonesian detainees in World War II. Talking to Australian War Memorial; if Jumaadi does create these, there is a possibility of them forming part of the National Collection. Also talking to the National Gallery of Indonesia about them being showcased there first.

6. GENERAL BUSINESS

- A list of donated works to the Mosman Art Collection for the 2017/2018 Financial Year was tabled. A large artwork by Salvatore Zofrea's depicting Balmoral is currently being considered for acquisition.
- The NPWS located artist residency that has been used by the Gallery for the past eight years is under threat. John Cheeseman to report back to the committee on residency options for the Gallery in the future.
- Tokkotai was recently Highly Commended in the Museum and Galleries National Awards.
- A new security/tracking system for artwoks is scheduled to be implemented in 2018/19.
- Scaffolding and other construction issues with the Civic Building may impact on Mosman Market stallholders during the Civic Centre refurbishment, dates TBC.
- Night-time economy initiatives: Council looking at staging a series of night-markets in Mosman Square. The Gallery is planning to open one night per week (Wednesdays), in line with other cultural institutions including the Art Gallery of New South Wales and MCA as part of Open Sydney. Dr John Yu suggested there be other entertainment in conjunction with this e.g. music, made mention of the genre of music previously played on the Manly Ferry. Open Gallery and Night Markets could

- John Cheeseman is currently revising Council's Public Art Policy.
- Ann Cape mentioned works for dementia awareness. To be discussed further with John Cheeseman.
- Neil Balnaves has acquired most of the works created by Tracey Moffatt for the Venice Biennale and has tentatively offered for the Gallery to show them. John Cheeseman is looking at finding room in the schedule for the exhibition in mid-2019.
- National Parks and Wildlife Services are spending money on their Armoured Casemates complex at Georges Heights and are keen to work with Council on using these for cultural purposes.
- The Committee commended Ann Shoebridge on the terrific job she has done on her work with the Creative Circle.
