8.	<p>DISCUSSION AROUND 2021 – 2025 MOSMAN COUNCIL DISABILITY INCLUSION ACTION PLAN AND COMMUNITY CONSULTATION SUGGESTIONS</p> <p>It was acknowledged that despite the impact of Covid-19, Council has still managed to achieve a lot in this space.</p> <p>‘Let’s Talk Disability’ workshop had to be cancelled the day before. Looking at offering the workshop via Zoom in November.</p> <p>It can be a challenge to accurately record the number of volunteers who are living with a disability. Council liaises with a number of organisations to obtain this information.</p> <p>Council has a small budget for the 2021 – 2025 DIAP Community Consultation. May need to look at alternative ways of doing this due to COVID-19. Consultation due to take place in early 2021.</p>

10.	<p>GENERAL BUSINESS</p> <p>Draft July 2019 to June 2020 Disability Inclusion Action Plan Annual Report was tabled by Manager Community Services and was noted by the Committee.</p> <p>It was noted that the Mosman Council Positive Ageing Framework is in development from a range of consultations that happened January – March 2020 based around the 8 domains in the ‘World Health Organisation Age Friendly Cities and Communities Guide’. The purpose of this is so that Council knows what direction to take to respond to the aging population and facilitate healthy/positive aging, using information from the</p>	

	<p>Royal Commission and feedback from the community. Council's survey received 199 responses.</p> <p>Requests from the public were raised for an accessible car space on the beach side of Mosman Junction and an extra accessible space or more ramps between the tram shed and Public Dining Room.</p> <p>The issue of tradesmen using the accessible car spaces on Middle Head Road was raised. Fines are being issued in an effort to curb the problem.</p> <p>Increased mental health issues during COVID-19 was discussed. Community Services are doing what they can to assist the community, including providing a space for Lifeline to deliver free counselling services to Mosman residents. R U OK? Day is on Thursday 10 September.</p>
