Committee members were encouraged to provide direct feedback to Council on any matters within MOSPLAN, with the closing date for submissions being 15 May 2022.	
7.	REVIEW OF RECENT AND CURRENT EXHIBITIONS AND INITIATIVES	
	Kelly McDonald provided the following update on exhibitions and events that have taken place since August last year:	
	• Upacara: Ceremonial Art from Southeast Asia featured works from the collection of Dr John Yu AC and the late Dr George Soutter AM. As lockdown was introduced after this exhibition opened, we produced a virtual tour to enable our audience to view the exhibition, even if they were unable to visit in person. We were able to host an In Conversation with Dr Yu and exhibition curator Dr Siobhan Campbell, as well as a symposium on collecting art from Southeast Asia.	
	• Leyla Stevens: Labour for Colours was commissioned to accompany Upacara. Documentation is shown of textile artisans on the Balinese island of Nusa Penida and the labours they enact to produce the cepuk style weaving that the island is known for.	
	Destination Sydney: The natural world was the third exhibition in a series of collaborations between three Sydney public galleries, Manly Art Gallery & Museum, Mosman Art Gallery and the National Trust's S. H. Ervin. <i>The natural world</i> focussed on artworks responding to the theme of Sydney as a place of creative endeavours, with a strong focus on the work of major Australian women artists, all connected by their concern for landscape, the natural world and the environment. Artists at Mosman Art Gallery include Janet Laurence, Caroline Rothwell and Robyn Stacey.	
	• Lisa Sammut: Full Circle was an exhibition of new work including objects and moving image that considered the length of a human life in connection to transitions and cycles in the cosmos; the circular, orbital, elliptical and eclipse.
