# 5. Review of recent and current exhibitions and initiatives

Kelly presented an overview of recent events and exhibitions. These included:

Mosman Youth Art Prize 2022 (14 May – 12 Jun)

 Exhibition opening, this year the event was specifically tailored for youth, held outside on Art Gallery Way, with pizza food truck, artist workshops and sponsor Audi providing a car for kids to draw on. Winners announced to over 1000 attending on the day, the opening was a huge success.

The Cube Exhibition (2 April – 3 July) by Taloi Havini

Exploration of her home in the islands of Bougainville

In Profile exhibition (23 April – 26 June) by Michelle Arnott

- Entered and finalist in MAP 2022
- Focus artworks on local areas such as Taronga Zoo

75 Years of Mosman Art Prize (18 June- 7 Aug) – history with art from Margaret Olley to Salote Tawale.

- 78 works exhibited from over 75 years of MAP
- Many visitors have come through the doors to enjoy the exhibition
- The Art Gallery hosted a series of In-Conversation relaxed setting talks, with artists Jasper Knight and Alan Jones, Cressida Campbell and Natasha Walsh and also Lucy Culliton and Elisabeth Cummings, all were very popular and booked out with waiting lists. The committee provided some suggestions to improve this format of presentations.
- Cressida Campbell's 'Studio' work is being loaned for display at the National Art Gallery in Canberra.

Stevie Fieldsend Exhibition (9 Jul - 2 Oct)

- Exhibition held in the Cube
- I do, I undo and redo, exhibition of hand sewn stockings representing strain of motherhood.

Toshiko Oiyama In Profile (2 Jul – 4 Sep)

- In Profile is a space for local artists displays
- Ink drawings with pierce holes and stitch

Ken Done Attack Exhibition (23 – 24 July)

- Pop up exhibition in Grand Hall for 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Japanese attack. Exhibition attracted large numbers
- Artworks to be displayed 3 9 Sep at Art Gallery, The Rocks, Sydney.

### 6. Overview of upcoming exhibitions and initiatives

Kelly provided an overview of upcoming events and exhibitions. These included:

Mosman Art Prize 2022 (27 Aug – 2 Oct)

- This year 845 artists submitted digital photos of art online. Entry numbers were up from previous years.
- The new format online has received positive feedback and this process allows for potential to increase numbers with online entries from across Australia.
- John noted the standard overall has lifted considerably and finalists have been selected across Australia and from many states that would not normally enter.
- 91 entries selected for exhibition
- Judge for MAP 2022 is Rhana Davenport, Director Art Gallery of South Australia. She will view finalists on 19 August.
- The last MAP was held in 2020 due to COVID.
- Staff promoted MAP across Australia via many platforms including social media, ads in Art media formats, phoning art schools, art galleries, emailing previous entrants and newsletter subscribers, to reach a wider audience.

- Dialogue across Sydney, in collaboration with Parramatta Artist Studios

# 7. Philanthropy update

#### 10 years of Balnaves Foundation celebration event

Plans underway for a significant event to celebrate 10 years of Balnaves Gift to Council

Art Gallery hope to expand quality works in the Mosman Art Collection. Event to include the launch of an artwork acquisition fund Acquisition of gifts will aid in expanding supporter base for the Gallery Imants Tillers work of Sirius Cove presented as a target piece of artwork for the artwork acquisition fund Ann reported that following up from a Bequest Information Session, community members have come forward and pledged to become part of the Gallery's Living Bequest program. Discussion amongst attendees regarding: What can the committee do for the Art Gallery? Ann discussed how committee members can help by supporting via memberships or higher level support with funds and/or new ideas. Two way discussions between Council and committee for advice and ideas for current and upcoming works Committee members to be advocates for Mosman Art Discussing at meetings a schedule for future plans/exhibits to help with ideas and opportunities. Some ideas suggested for fundraising – car boot art sale or silent auctions of art It was noted that a new sculptural bust of Allan Border may be commissioned for the cricket pavilion Wednesday Night Lights – potential to host evening events that link with community and opportunities linked to Allan Border Pavilion/sporting groups Mosman Art Gallery is connected to regional galleries for events and policies to help and support across regional areas for art events and partnerships. It was noted that Northern Beaches Council are developing new creative space and events, and that \$10million from amalgamation went to public art work on Northern beaches. Public art by Indigenous artist Maddison Gibbs will be included in the walkway development at Bradley's Head. Rust has appeared on welded areas on Ann Cape work at Allan Border Oval, to be investigated for repairs. Ann thanked both Cathy and Andrew Cameron for generously providing their home for Private Supper following Mosman Art Prize Opening – with judge, winning artists, Mosman Mayor, Art & Culture Committee and key Gallery supporters. Relaunch of the Balnaves Gift exhibition and announcement 8. of Education Program and Acquisition Fund supported by the Balnaves Foundation and Balnaves family. Discussed above 9. **General Business** 

The following items were raised by members for discussion: Mosman Art Walk (Fiona Ackerman) • Future fundraiser Mosman Walk and art walks, to include the community, and planning for a local community event to raise funds for Art Department at Mosman High School. Last event, \$40k of art works was sold. 30 retailers along Military Road, Mosman participating and 30 artworks included for the Mosman Art Walk. Funds have purchased materials including art books for Year 12 art students, and six cameras for students. Mosman Walk – there will be an App for people to download and round stickers on the ground to see artworks in Mosman shops. School gain 25% commission and artist 75% in conjunction with local businesses. Teresa suggested to start and finish the Art Walk at Mosman Art Gallery followed by artist talks. Generally all artwork is of PG rating. Event is gaining positive traction It was suggested a studio or workshop in one or some of the Mosman empty shops. Australian film festival in Mosman over the summer of 22/23 (Tristan Milani) This matter was raised but not discussed. **MEETING CONCLUDED AT 6:10PM**
