	and are based around impacts of climate change and actions	
	that can be taken related to politics, energy, money, learning	
	from first nations culture or sharing stories. The approach is	
	based on social research that explains that people process	
	information best through conversations with people they trust.	
	This is how we make sense of information, make decisions,	
	take actions, and how social change happens.	
	They've taken the party-plan model and adapted it to allow	
	meaningful discussions about climate change to happen at	
	scale. A host invites friends to their home, where a trained	
	facilitator presents information, answers questions and	
	facilitates a discussion about climate change. At the end of the	
	discussion, they invite guests to join in taking regular action	
	and to host their own Climate Conversation with their friends.
