Mosman Library's Local Studies Librarian, Donna Braye, compiled oral histories of attendees for future reference. Future events may occur every two years.	
	Plans are underway to produce a series of short films featuring artists such as Susan Rothwell and Imants Tillers. A piece on John Olsen had been	

	planned but not able to be realised before his passing, although the Gallery is currently in conversation with his family.	
	Parramatta Artist Studios invited MAG to visit their spaces, however they are currently moving premises. MAG also plans to arrange visits to Teresa Biet's Art Incubator studios in September.	A&CCCC members
	Drafts of the revised Mosman Art Collection and Public Art polices were tabled and members invited to provide any feedback to John for consideration.	
	Mosman Square renovations are due to finish soon with the launch to coincide with the returned Mosman Market in August. Both Anne Ferguson's fountain and Ann Cape's trough will remain, with the Antico fountain moved and the Barry O'Keefe foundation to be relocated closer to the library. Small sculptural works based on Aboriginal rock carvings originally recorded at Middle Head will be incorporated into the entrance wall with other interpretive signage of the Borogegal and Cammeraigal people to be included in the future.

	<ul> <li>Guest judge for the 2023 Mosman Art Prize will be previous Archibald Prize winner, Fiona Lowry. Last year MAP received 845 entries with 91 selected to be hung</li> <li>Fiona Ackerman advised that Mosman High School will be providing the Gallery with a Year 7 students visual art display on seed pods to be displayed for NAIDOC Week.</li> <li>Mosman Art Prize will be followed by a major Imants Tillers exhibition (11 November 2023 – 4 February 2024).</li> <li>Upcoming shows in The Cube include works by Meng-Yu Yan and Anna May Kirk as well as last year's Mosman Art Prize winner, Jacobus Capone.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>The Mosman Art Gallery has received \$257,000 cash from all donations, sponsorships, acquisition commitments and bequests in 2022/2023.</li> <li>In-kind donation of artworks received to date have been valued at \$135,000, (assessed by independent valuers)</li> <li>New donor category of a 'Visionary' supporter has been created, with total one year donation of \$20,000 per year for 1 year received from Ingrid Kaiser.</li> <li>An end of financial year campaign was conducted with \$2000 raised to support a project with artist educators Tully Arnot and Lisa Andrew.</li> <li>Two key supporter videos will be produced by Motel Picture Company featuring Carol and Brian Carrigan and Ken and Judy Done.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Mosman Art Gallery was successful in its application to Create NSW for annual program funding of \$95,000. An expression of interest to apply for multi-year funding to Create NSW has been submitted.</li> </ul>	
	Acquisition fund	
	<ul> <li>The Gallery had sought to purchase Henry Fullwood's Old Mosman Wharf artwork at a recent auction but was the under bidder (the Gallery will make enquiries re the potential to borrow this work in the future). Gallery staff are also compiling a list of possible artists and artworks to be considered for future acquisition campaigns, including contemporary Aboriginal artworks and historic works of Mosman. Once compiled, a list will be distributed to A&amp;CCCC members for comment.</li> </ul>	A&CCCC and Kelly McDonald

	<ul> <li>Hunters and Collectors Valuation Day was held on 1 April 2023: income was \$7500 less expenses, raising \$3,500 in donations.</li> </ul>	

 Morgan Car Club have offered to provide vehicles at future events including upcoming Mosman Market due to restart on 5 August, once Mosman Square reconstruction works have been completed.

#### Foundations update

- Balnaves Foundation Art Mosman: Balnaves Education, details of this project are in final stages and collateral is in production. This year funds have been directed to the Raise the Youth/MYAP opening in partnership with Mosman Youth Centre.
- Staff are currently investigating an additional proposal to the Balnaves Foundation with a focus on First Nations education program and an ongoing Youth Event focus.
- John presented the Interpretive Foreshore Signage Report to a recent Council meeting. The project is funded by the Balnaves Foundation. The project is based on the concept of a physical and interactive art walking trail along Mosman foreshores with 12 signs including QR codes, picture of collection artworks and artwork information. Draft of text has been prepared by Lucy Reeves-Smith for plaques. Expected to be completed in early 2024. Support currently being sought from both Sydney Harbour Federation Trust and National Parks and Wildlife Services to site three of the signs on sites they control. It is proposed to call the project the 'Mosman Art Trail'.

- The Albert Hotel Mosman has offered a new ongoing partnership a 15% discount on Gallery related bookings and will give the judge and winner of the Mosman Art Prize a free night stay.
- Exhibition Partnerships Yasmin Smith publication to be launched at a private event at Mosman Art Gallery on 30 August.
- A&CCCC members encouraged the investigation into online systems
  to better facilitate future bequests. Members made a suggestion that
  flyers be placed at front of Gallery on 'how to make a bequest'. Plans
  are underway to revise Friends of Gallery membership forms to
  include bequest options.

Members raised the possibility of Boronia House being used as artist studios. The committee were advised that Council had resolved to enter into a lease with a commercial tenant.
