To be submitted to Council’s April 2024 meeting for adoption.</p> <p>RA – Suggested elements of snapshot of Mosman stay in document but agreed it could be reduced.</p> <p>RA – MOSPLAN information can be reduced with an acknowledgement of MOSPLAN. Asked about food organic collections for Mosman LGA.</p> <p>SS – Provided an update on Council’s food organic collection investigations. Major study completed by NSROC. Whilst it is a good idea the cost benefit analysis does not stack up and C02-e savings are minimal. Limited processing infrastructure in Sydney and also end markets are questionable also issue of contamination.</p> <p>Praise received from committee members for mitigation work completed to date.</p>	<p>PM - to use feedback from committee in update of Mitigation Strategy</p>

Cool Seats: composting system in raised garden bed, to be installed at two preschools and near a café for business food waste recycling. Mosman Businesses Heading to Net Zero and Less Waste initiative. LED Lighting audits: have been completed for the Civic Centre, Library Youth Centre and Art Gallery.
