

Watercraft Permit Conditions

- 1. Immediately affix your permit to the watercraft within 14 days from the date of the permit offer letter
- 2. If the permit is not visible the watercraft will be placed with a Notice to Remove Dinghy/Kayak
- 3. Councils Authorised Officer will be carrying out regular audits to ensure lawful storage of watercraft along with maintaining the visual amenity to the reserves and foreshore areas.
- 4. To affix the permit, ensure that the watercraft surface is dry, clean, and free of all salt, sand, dust etc. The permit is to be displayed in a position on the watercraft which will be easily visible when the watercraft is stored.
- 5. All watercraft is to be stored wholly within the allocated space and is not to impede access to other racks or storage spaces.
- 6. You will be contacted annually to pay the required fee. If you fail to pay any fee the watercraft will be taken possession of by Council, removed and disposed of and a penalty infringement notice may be issued.
- 7. You must advise Council in writing if you no longer require the use of the watercraft storage area.
- 8. You cannot "on-sell" or transfer the agreement under any circumstances.
- 9. You must give Council immediate notice of any damage, defect or deterioration affecting the watercraft storage area.
- 10. No maintenance or repair work shall be carried out on the vessels in the Reserve or on the beach, and the area shall be kept in a clean and tidy state.
- 11. Use of the facility is for private purposes only.
- 12. No more than 2 watercrafts can be stored in a rack or allocated storage area without a rack (Kayak and smaller watercraft designated areas are excluded. Refer to the condition below). Both watercrafts are to pay an annual fee as per Council's adopted fees and charges. Each watercraft in the rack is to display a permit.
- 13. Storage racks or allocated storage areas without racks that are specifically designated for kayaks and smaller vessel storage are to store no more than 1 watercraft with the provision that the Council may consider exceptions where space allows for the safe and secure storage of 2 watercraft in a single allocated spot.
- 14. Any vessels found on the Reserve or Racks that do not comply with the conditions set out above shall be taken possession of and removed by a third party engaged by Council.
